

OKLAHOMA VOTER GUIDE

2020 General Election

Early Voting: Oct. 29-31, 2020 | Election Day: Nov. 3, 2020

Cornerstone is pleased to provide this voter guide to the 2020 Oklahoma elections. The purpose of this guide is not to influence voting but rather to provide information that will assist in research prior to voting. You can also check out the OK Voter Portal to identify polling places, sample ballots, etc.

KEY DATES

- Deadline to request absentee ballot: Oct. 27
- Early in-person voting at your county election board:
 - o Thursday, Oct. 29, 8 a.m. 6 p.m.
 - o Friday, Oct. 30, 8 a.m. 6 p.m.
 - O Saturday, Oct. 31, 9 a.m. 2 p.m.
- Election Day: Nov. 3, 2020

OKLAHOMA SENATE

Every two years, half of the 48 seats in the Oklahoma Senate are up for reelection. This year, eight of the senators drew no opponent and were automatically elected. That means, with only 25 seats up for election (24 plus one vacancy), one-third of the Senate races were already decided before the June primary and five more were decided after the primary—all currently held by Republicans. This means that even before the general election, Republicans are guaranteed 28 seats and will likely retain as many as 11 more.

Put another way, there is little doubt there will be any partisan shift in Senate leadership and Republicans will retain a commanding majority.

OKLAHOMA HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

Unlike the Senate, all House seats are contested every two years. Nearly 40% (41 seats) were uncontested and decided before the primary (37 Republicans and four Democrats).

Furthermore, 21 seats were decided in the June primary (20 Republicans and one Democrat). Put another way, 72 races (67 Republicans and five Democrats) have already been decided.

CONGRESS

One U.S. Senate seat, held by Republican Jim Inhofe, is up for re-election.

Oklahoma has five seats in the U.S. House of Representatives (four Republicans and one Democrat). All five incumbents are running for reelection.
