3. National involvement (within the last year): Describe involvement at the GAC, Hike the Hill, etc. (1-20)

5. Cornerstone Advocacy program engagement: Describe involvement in programs like UNITE, Payroll Deduction, Project Zip Code, Calls to Action response, etc. (1-10)
6. Contributions: What does the Nominee Support? CUPAC of MO, America's Credit Union PAC. (up to 5 points)
7. Letter of recommendation (5 points). *This is required and your nomination will be complete once we receive a letter of recommendation.
