Update Project Zip Code

Congressional districts have become a hot topic lately, as seen in Texas, where the U.S. District Court in El Paso struck down the redistricting map drawn in August of this year. With that as background, we at Cornerstone believe it's very timely for each credit union to update their information in Project Zip Code (PZC). This powerful, secure, and user-friendly tool helps demonstrate the full strength of the credit union movement.

PZC matches your member data by state legislative district, congressional district, and county, then securely uploads those totals to America's Credit Unions' national database. When combined with data from credit unions across the country, it creates a master census showing just how many credit union members live in every lawmaker's district, a critical resource for effective advocacy.

Updating your PZC data isn't just good for the movement; it also benefits your operations. Your credit union can view member counts by geographic area to support decisions around ATM placement, shared branching, and growth planning. PZC uses the most accurate legislative district information available, giving you confidence that your advocacy outreach is targeted and up to date.

The software is compatible with most databases and won't affect your existing member data. Your personal information stays secure throughout the process: data is uploaded through a secure login, encrypted, matched, and returned to you for download. Only aggregate totals remain in the national system.

A few minutes of updating today can make a big difference in the year ahead. Get started below.
